VETERAN'S CORNER



For most, Memorial Day is the unofficial start of summer. It's a chance to get a free day off work and school, and a convenient excuse to escape to the shore for the first time

of the year. But for veterans and their families, Memorial Day is solemn, it's reflective, and it's a time for them to remember fallen brothers and sisters. We are recognizing all the soldiers all the way from the Revolutionary War to the present that have died and given us the liberties so we are able to have those family cook-outs and get-togethers.

Memorial Day occurs on the last Monday in May and marks the solemn time when Americans honor the soldiers that died in military service. When the observance was first declared in 1868 by General John Logan, it was called Decoration Day in reference to a tradition of decorating the graves of those whose lives were lost in the Civil War and its set date was May 30. In the years following World War I, the day picked up the more inclusive name Memorial Day as people began to use it as time to honor all who died in all US wars. For many, the holiday signifies the unofficial beginning of the summer season

There is frequent confusion between Memorial Day and its companion holiday, Veterans Day. The purpose of Memorial Day is to honor those who have died in American military service, while November 11, Veterans Day, is for those who have served the US in war and survived. Memorial Day's concept is for all of us to reflect on our citizens whose efforts gave us freedom but whose sacrifices prevent them from enjoying it.

My wish is however you enjoy the day, please take a moment and reflect on those who lost their lives and gave all so that we continue to enjoy our freedom. Having grown up in a military town, with a father who served in the Korean & WWII, there's a special place in my heart for everyone who lost their lives for this country. God Bless the USA.
